



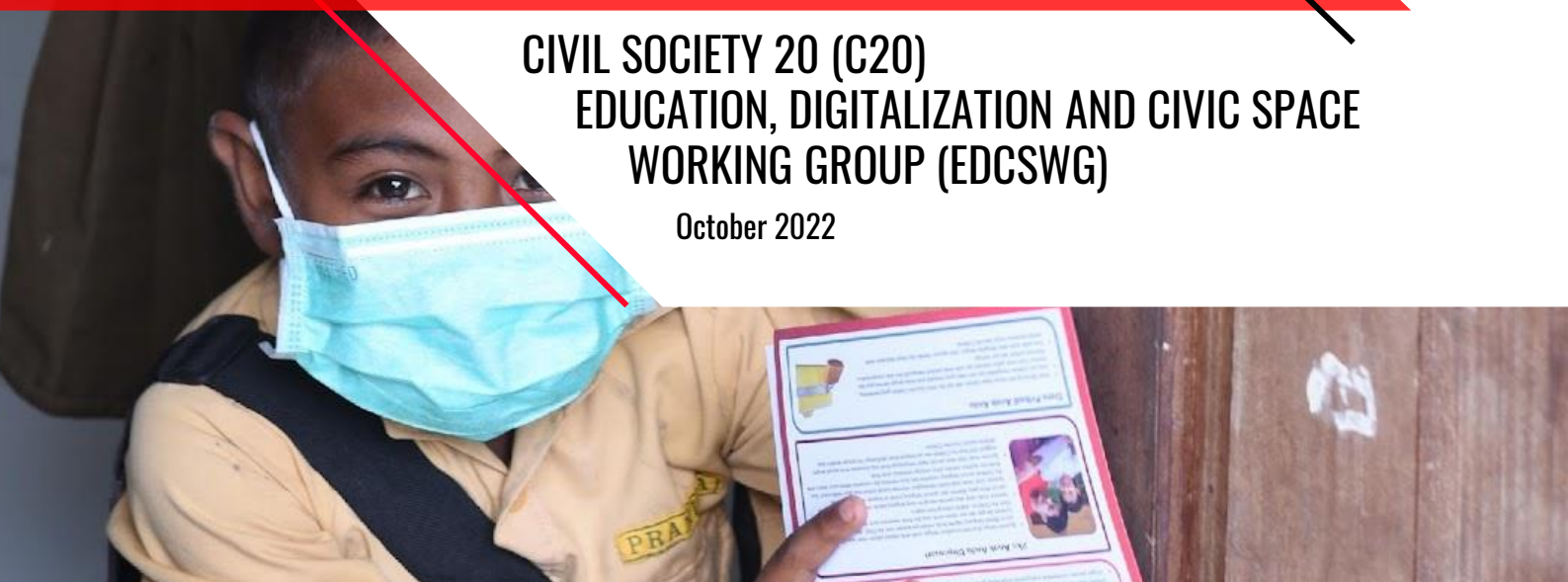

REMARKS



Tata Sudrajat, Save The Children Indonesia Deputy Chief of Program Impact Creation – C20 Steering Committee:

“As Indonesia holds the Presidency of G20 in 2022, it is a great opportunity to involve in the Civil Society (C20) engagement platform. It has been very important for Save the Children's engagement, as we want Civil Society to voice children's issues. Children's issues on rights to vaccines and education have been included in the C20 policy recommendations and we expect that the G20 will take it into account. The G20 is a very important international forum as it represents more than 2/3 of the world population, 75% of global trade, and 80% of the world GDP. The G20 is very powerful in determining global policy and programs. The next G20 Presidency in 2023 is in India. Save the Children Indonesia's engagement in the G20 in 2022 is the continuation of Save the Children Italy's involvement in 2021, and I hope that Save the Children in other countries can carry on the tradition of such engagement at the global level when the G20 Presidency comes the country where they operate.”

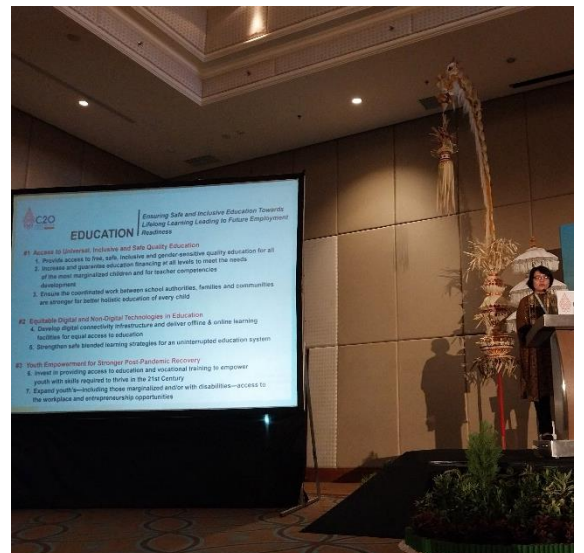

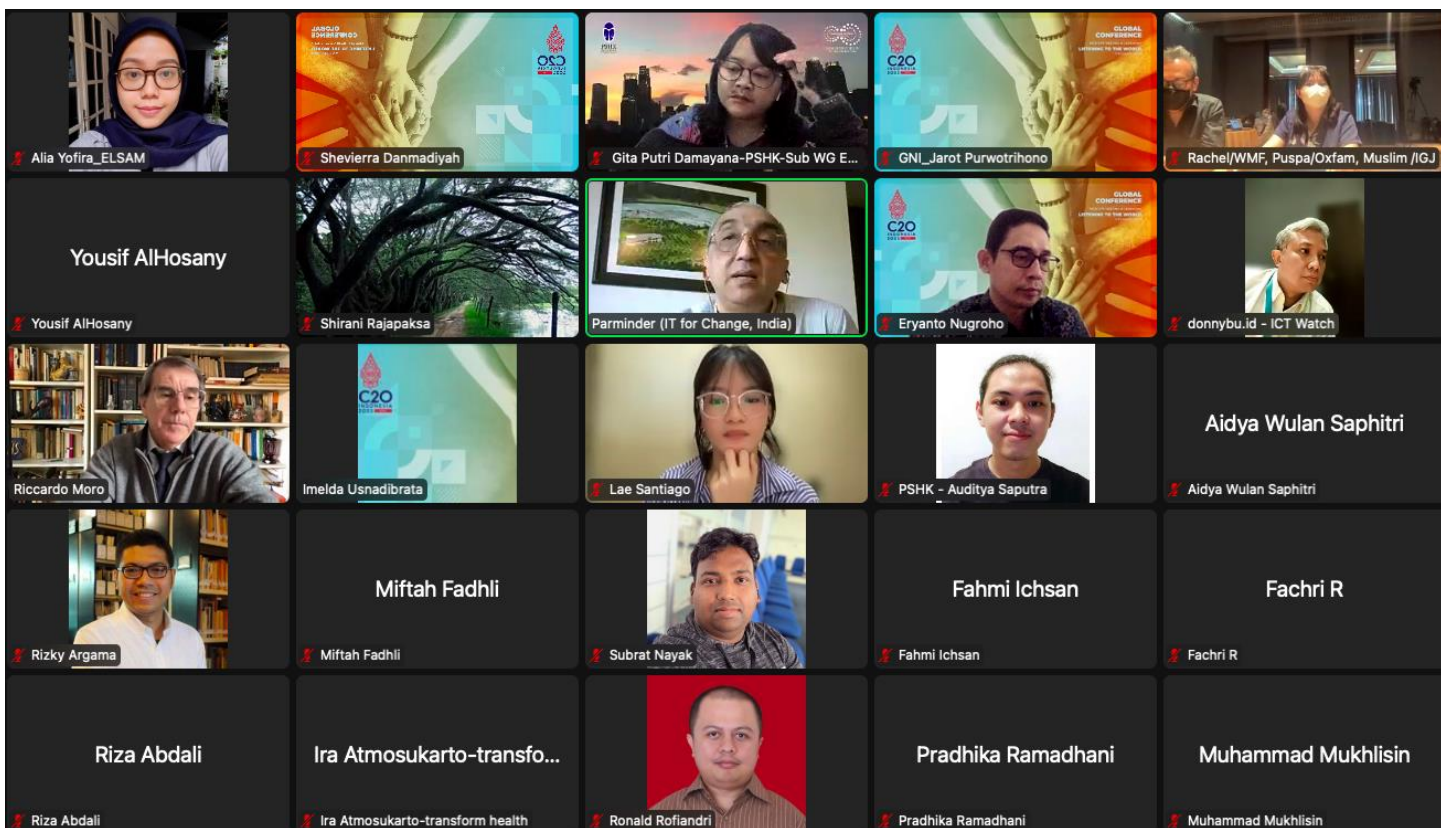

SUMMARY

The session was dedicated to the introduction of all members and leaders of the Education, Digitalization, and Civic Space Working Group (EDCSWG), the priority issues of each sub-working group, as well as the presentation of the working group’s agenda and timeline.

At this point, there were two issues brought up by the Education Sub-Working Group, namely, (i) quality and inclusivity of Education, which included the use of digital technology and blended learning, and (ii) strengthening skills for the future of work.

The Digitalization Sub-Working Group focused on two areas: (i) Health Architecture and (ii) Digital Transformation, both comprising the issues of Inclusive Digital ID, Human Rights Approach to Cross-Border Data Flows, and Open and Free Knowledge.

While the Civic Space Sub-Working Group introduced three issues: (i) Protecting and Expanding Civic Space, (ii) Putting an End to Attacks, and (iii) Criminalization and Stigmatization of Civic Space.

The keynote speech was delivered by Save the Children Indonesia Chief Executive Officer (CEO), Selina Patta Sumbung, who called on all C20 EDCSWG members to ensure that children's right issue are taken into account and highlighted in every document, policy brief, policy message, policy asks, and brought to the public's attention through the media.

HIGHLIGHTS

The issues covered in the meeting included:

- Children, especially girls faced the rise of child marriage during the pandemic, which has left them vulnerable to various kinds of gender-based violence, as well as education and economic inequities. – **Putri Gayatri, Youth Representative, Children and Youth Advisory Network (CYAN)**
- Not only that, but children also faced a higher risk of technology-facilitated violence during lockdowns as their engagement with digital technologies increased. They mostly experienced data and privacy breaches, online grooming, online sexual violence, and cyberbullying. – **Dr Ahmad Sofian, National Coordinator, End Child Prostitution and Trafficking (ECPAT)**
- Around 57% of households don't have reliable internet access, and this has affected children's learning outcome at home. It is projected that PISA score drop due to disruptions caused by COVID-19. – **Dr Vivi Yulaswati, Senior Advisor, Ministry of National Development Planning (G20 Development Working Group / DEWG)**
- The COVID-19 pandemic has, by and large, caused the "lost decade of immunization." – **Karrar Karrar, Senior Health Advisor, Save the Children International**
- On top of the above, children are also vulnerable when it comes to climate injustices, especially if they are from economically marginalized groups, and of migrant backgrounds. The exclusion of Child Rights in the policy-making process will make the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) unachievable. The whole-of-society approach is needed, and climate financing should be increased. – **Shaheen Chughtai, Regional Advocacy and Campaigns Director, Save the Children International, ARO**

SUMMARY

This was the first Global Consultation, held after the Kick-Off Meeting and Ceremony, as the beginning of the series of discussions that the C20 Education, Digitalization and Civic Space (EDCSWG) would organize, to represent its 151 members from 41 countries. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the key priority issues as well as to understand where the Education Sub-Working Group was concerning the recommendations to G20 leaders. The Education, Digitalization and Civic Space Working Group (EDCSWG) Coordinator, Imelda Tirra Usnadibrata, firstly presented the priority issues set by the G20 Education Working Group (EdWG), namely: (1) Universal Quality Education; (2) Digital Technologies in Education; (3) Solidarity and Partnerships; and (4) Future of Work Post-COVID-19.

The meeting was also the occasion to review the key recommendations made and put forth in the C20 Italy 2021 Policy Pack, which were, among others: (i) Closing the education financing gap; (ii) Using lifelong learning to build a democratic culture; (iii) Developing Education 4.0 through the promotion of Global Citizenship; (iv) Transforming education at the service of Sustainable Development; and (v) Promoting gender equality and women's and girls' empowerment in and through education.

EDUCATION SUB-WORKING GROUP GLOBAL CONSULTATION

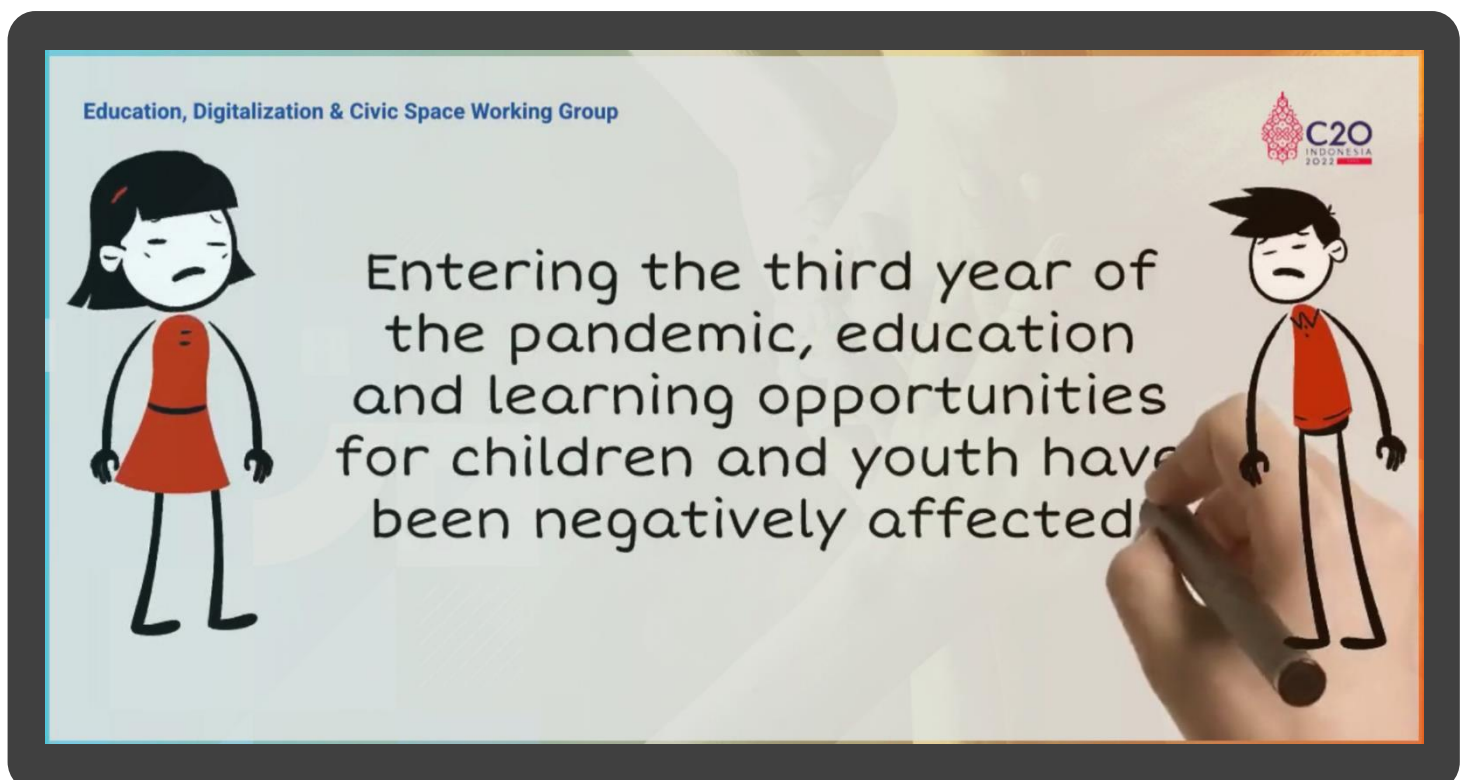
Based on the priority issues set by the G20 EdWG and the recommendations made during the C20 Italy 2021, the C20 Indonesia 2022 Education Sub-Working Group decided to deliver its recommendations through three main issues: (1) Access to Inclusive and Safe Quality Education, Supporting Gender Equality; (2) Transformative Digital Technologies for Equitable Education, Focusing on Developing Digital Infrastructure and Teacher Training; and (3) Empowering Youth with 21st-century working skills.

However, there were still concerns regarding the number of recommendations formulated at this stage by the C20 Education Sub-Working Group, which would expectedly be less effective. Adjustments were to reduce redundancy and to make policy asks more straightforward and more coherent.

The participants, moreover, also discussed the working plan of the working group which included the organization of webinars for policy brief dissemination, lobbying/advocacy work, and media meetings. The lack of resources was the highlight of the discussion as an impediment to the future work of the working group. Although partnering with the private sector was evoked as a solution, the drawbacks of this possible partnership should be calculated.

Finally, a **video campaign** was also introduced during the meeting as a way to disseminate policy issues to the general public. The feedback for the video was the use of qualitative data that were too Indonesian in context. The producer, Tamara Amalia, responded by attempting to include diverse contexts to make the video more inclusive. The video hereafter would be played at future events/meetings/webinars held by the C20 EDCSWG.

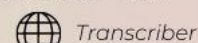

BACKGROUND

The 2nd Global Webinar, entitled “Transformative Digital Technologies for Equitable Education”, focused on the issue of the rise of Education Technologies and distance/remote learning during social restriction. While hybrid or blended teaching/learning would be one of the learning strategies in the future, problems posed by this should be addressed, including the digital divide, technology-facilitated violence, privacy concerns, as well as corporate capture of online modalities.

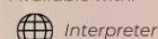

BACKGROUND

The 3rd Global Webinar, entitled “Gender, Disability and Social Inclusion in Education, Digitalization and Civic Space”, put an emphasis on the need in mainstreaming gender equality, disability, and social inclusion in education is raised due to broader implications of inequality in education towards some other aspects, such as community well-being and economic growth. This webinar was a collaborative effort between the C20 Education, Digitalization, and Civic Space Working Group (EDCSWG) and Women-20 (W20).

A representative from the G20 Development Working Group (DWG), Amich Alhumami, Ph.D.—Director of Religious Affairs, Education and Culture of the Indonesian Ministry of National Development Planning (Bappenas)—delivered his keynote speech on “Strengthening Access to Quality Education for Girls, Disabled and Other Marginalized Learners”.

- Ensuring a transparent, inclusive, and democratic dialogue space between the C20 and the G20 Working Groups in order to accommodate the recommendations of civil society as a commitment of the G20 leaders.
- Presenting and sharpening Indonesia's C20 policy priority issues and recommendations to the G20 Sherpas, working groups, and the public.
- Consolidating the C20 working groups.

SUMMARY

During the C20 EDCSWG Breakout Session, each sub-working group presented its policy recommendations to the G20 and invited counterparts. The policy recommendations of the Education Sub-Working Group were presented by Rinsan Tobing, the Digitalization Sub-Working Group by Alia Yofira, and the Civic Space Sub-Working Group by Gita Putri Damayana.

On Digitalization—and to some extent the concerns on digital technologies in Education—the G20 DEWG counterpart agreed that there would need to be a major balancing of multisectoral interests, speaking of data flows and privacy.

The Indonesian Ministry of Justice and Human Rights confirmed that, by and large, the demands raised by the Civic Space Sub-Working Group corresponded with the Indonesian 1945 Constitution and the Law Concerning Human Rights (1999), and hoped that the issues of Civic Space would be more integrated into the amendment of the law.

The Indonesian National Commission for Human Rights stated that although it has the same interests as the C20 Civic Space Sub-Working Group, it had not been involved in the G20. The C20 should encourage further public engagement, not just with NGOs, but also with smaller public organizations and marginalized people, in formulating public policies.

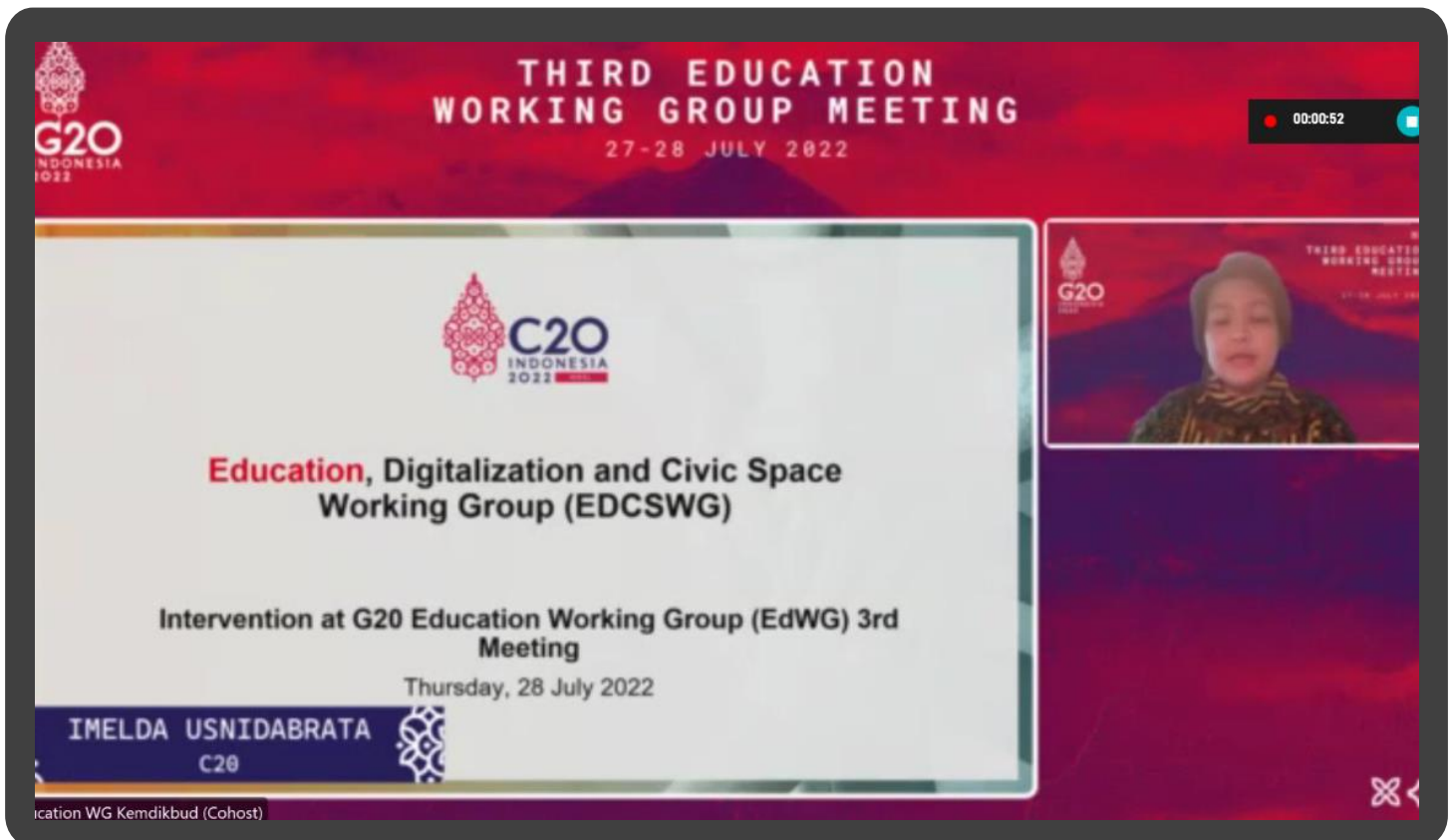
The G20 Education Working Group (EdWG), led by the Indonesian Ministry of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology (MoECRT) invited the C20 to give a 3-minute intervention in its 3rd meeting, which was conducted on 27 – 28 July 2022 with the theme of 'Solidarity and Partnership'.

To convey an inclusive voice of civil society to the G20 leaders in this meeting, the C20 Education Sub-Working Group team requested all members for providing **input** for the intervention delivered by the C20 Education, Digitalization, and Civic Space Working Group (EDCSWG) Coordinator, Imelda Usnadibrata. The 3-minute intervention was successfully done on 28 July 2022.

Besides the C20, another Official Engagement Group, the T20, also gave an intervention. In a press release, the G20 EdWG / Indonesian MoECRT stated that the issues brought up by the C20, as well as the T20, were already in line with the G20 agenda.

The C20 Education Sub-Working Group expressed its gratitude and appreciation to all members who provided input/feedback and to the G20 EdWG for recognizing the voice of the C20 on the importance of children and youth education.

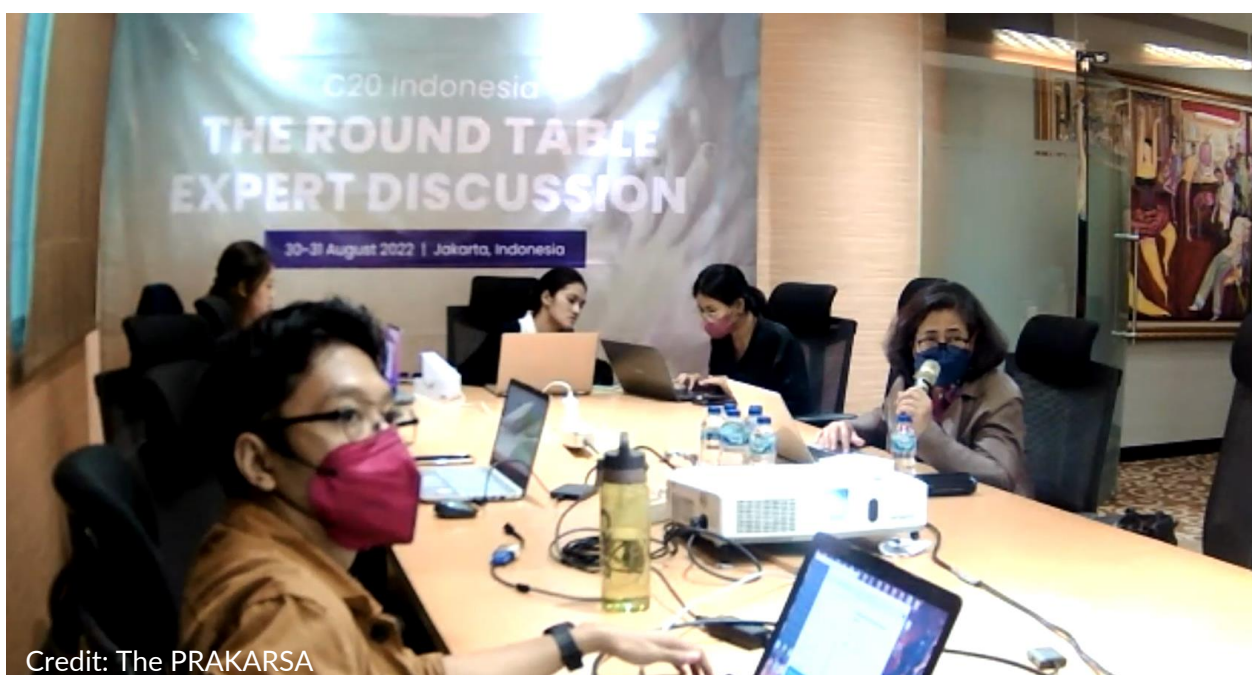

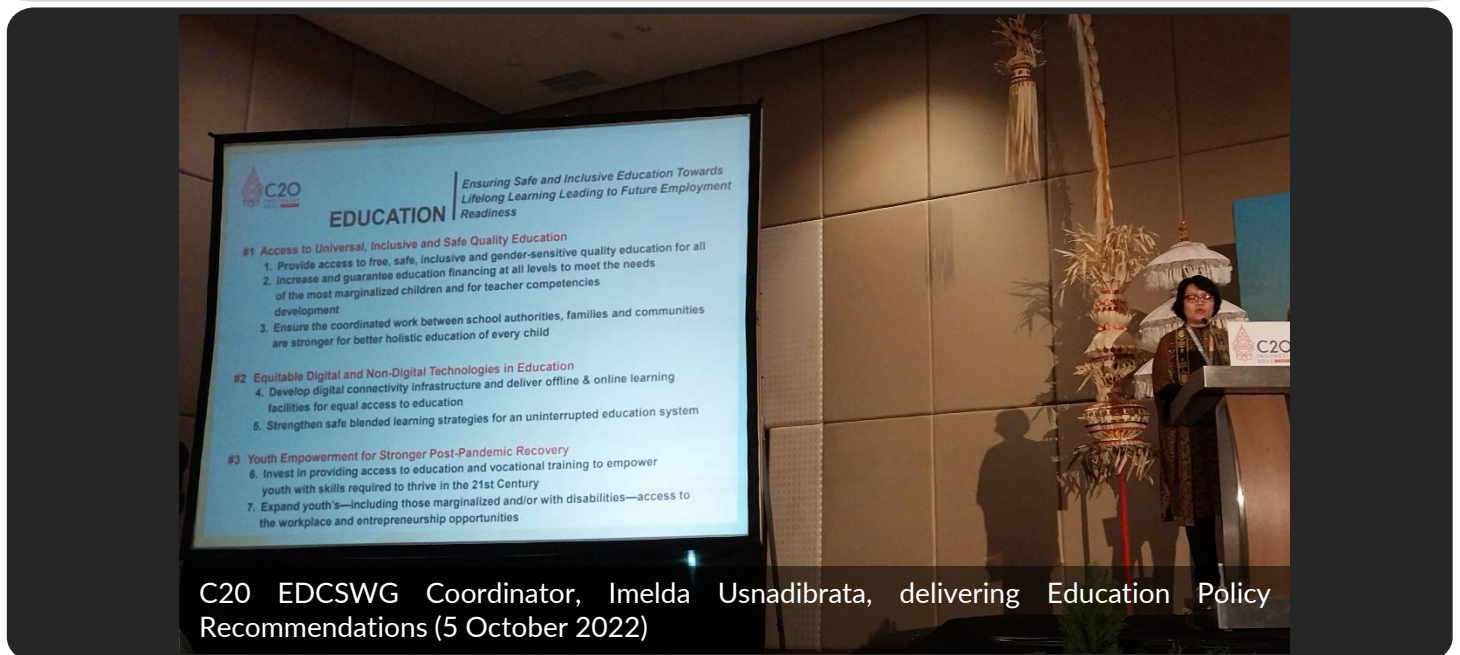
