



CIANJUR EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE UPDATE



Save the Children

10 March 2023

General Overview

An earthquake of magnitude 5.6 occurred on Monday 21 November 2022 at 1:21 pm local time struck Cianjur District, West Java, Indonesia, as reported by Indonesia's Meteorology, Climatology, and Geophysical Agency (BMKG). According to preliminary data, the earthquake epicenter was in land at a shallow depth of 10 km and located 12 km southwest of the city Cianjur, West Java Province.

As per 20/12 17:00 PM, The District Disaster Management Agency (BPBD - Cianjur) reported the earthquake has caused at least 635 people dead with 37% are children, 73.693 people displaced, and 62.628 houses damaged.

Administrative building has been damaged including 14 Hospitals. Several infrastructures reported with light and medium damaged, 375 schools reported damaged with light until heavy damaged.

Save the Children Indonesia Emergency Response Team is continuously delivering humanitarian aid since 22/11 to help the immediate needs of children and families impacted by the earthquake.







SCIDN response focused on

- Raising awareness of the community about potential aftershocks and their impact by distribution of IEC materials and awareness building in the field.
- Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS)
- Protect Children from Violence and Provide Alternative Care
- Support Children to Return Safely Back to School and Continuously Learning
- Water, sanitation and hygiene issues
- Support Children to Have a Healthy Start in Life
- Non-Food Item (NFI) Distribution

Save the Children is working with a local partner on responding the earthquake. Currently, we are working with LPBI NU for the NFI distribution and PMI (Indonesia Red Cross) for clean water distribution and SEMAK Foundation for PSS activities. We also conducted an induction session for our partners to ensure partners understand Save the Children's humanitarian standards and deliverables.

No issue on humanitarian access, yet it requires further observation for effective response operations

Our Response Objective

Our objective is to save lives and alleviate suffering of children and families affected by the earthquake in Cianjur district- West Java - Indonesia

Our Response Summary

In the first 24 hours, Save the Children Indonesia together with LPBI NU and PMI (local partner) have deployed a team to conduct rapid needs assessment and identified the most priority needs. Meanwhile, we have also dispatched initial NFI emergency items from Jakarta to Cianjur, West Java Province to be distributed in the first week.

By the end of emergency phase, on 20th December 2022, we have distributed non-food items, including shelter kit, family hygiene kits, children hygiene kits, buckets and jerrycans, sport and recreations kits, We have activated more than 8 location of Child Friendly Spaces to make children activities like Psychosocial Support (PSS), hygiene promotion, and other child protection awareness raising. WE intensified our WASH response, by working with PMI, Municipal Waterworks and District Health Office for distribution of clean water and installation of clean

water tanks. While for education, SCIDN worked with District Education Office to lead the cluster coordination and conduct the Back-to-School Campaign.

To date, we are still working in Cianjur, West Java Province to support affected people in the transition to recovery phase.

Until end of February, SCIDN started IYCF response in collaboration with PMI. The education response focused on the provision of Temporary Learning Spaces and Teaching & Learning kits, as well as delivery a series of trainings on Education in Emergencies (EiE), PSS, and Comprehensive School Safety. For Child Protection, the response focused on leading the CP sub-cluster coordination, reactivation of Cianjur Children's Forum and delivery of capacity building for CP stakeholders and social workers on Case Management, CPIE Minimum Standards, and Parenting Without Violence.

Our Works So Far



Non-Food Items

- Distributed shelter kits to 798 households.
- Distributed family hygiene kits to 1,382 families.
- Distributed children hygiene kits to 271 children.
- Distributed 5000 masks for 971 adults and 730 children
- Distributed Dignity kits to women and girls



Child Protection

- 2.136 Children; including 5 children with disabilities, have participated in PSS activities until 23 Dec 2022.
- Conducted PSS support and training for 157 teachers from 4 different schools in Cianjur. The training was aiming to support stress release for teacher impacted by the earthquake and also preparing teachers to be able to conduct PSS activity for their students.
- Save the Children Indonesia (SCIDN) delivered induction on Child Safeguarding to the task team including Sensitization on Psychosocial First Aid to task team, Ministry of Women Empowerment and Child Protection, National Disaster Management Agency (BNPB), Community Cadres, Association of Psychologists, Technical Units under Office of Women Empowerment and Child Protection (OWEP)
- SCIDN lead the Child Protection sub-cluster in Cianjur together with OWEP in district level (DPPKBP3A). In addition, we supported the reactivation of Children Forum in Cianjur.
- SCIDN conducted Case Management and Referral System Training on 25-26 January, attended by 22 participants (14F; 8M) from social workers from Social Dept and DPPKBP3A in district and sub-district level.
- Conducted Child Protection in Emergency Minimum Standard Training on 15-16 February 2023, attended by 30 participants (8M; 22F) from social workers from Social Dept and DPPKBP3A in district and sub-district level.
- Conducted Parenting Without Violence Training of Trainers on 15-16 Feb, participated by 30 participants (3M; 27F).



Education

- 26 Temporary Learning Shelters (TLS) or tents have been placed based on coordination with District Education Office (DEO).
- SCIDN conducted PSS program directly to SMP 1-2-3-PGRI Warung Kondang at 26 Nov and SMP 3-Cokro-AI Ianah-An Nur Hadis
- SCIDN lead Education Cluster in sub-national together with District Education Office.
- SCIDN supported the EiE and PSS Master Trainers in 35 trained schools in taking forward their action plan to cascade the training module to other teachers in their respective schools. 496 Teachers (193M, 303F) are benefitting from the cascade training held in 25 schools.
- The roll out of Integrated PSS module is ongoing in the assisted schools.
- Completed 3 batches of Safe Schools training, attended by 119 participants (61 M; 58F), consist of school principals, teachers, and school committees from 38 assisted schools.
- As part of the advocacy effort to enforce the Safe School program implementation in Cianjur, SCIDN worked together with other NGOs (WVI and Plan) to initiate the establishment of Safe School Secretariat in district level and the issuance of Safe School regulation. A workshop with related government stakeholders and Safe School actors in the district was conducted and the local government stated their commitment to work together for Safe School program. The Safe School regulation is currently on drafting process.



Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)

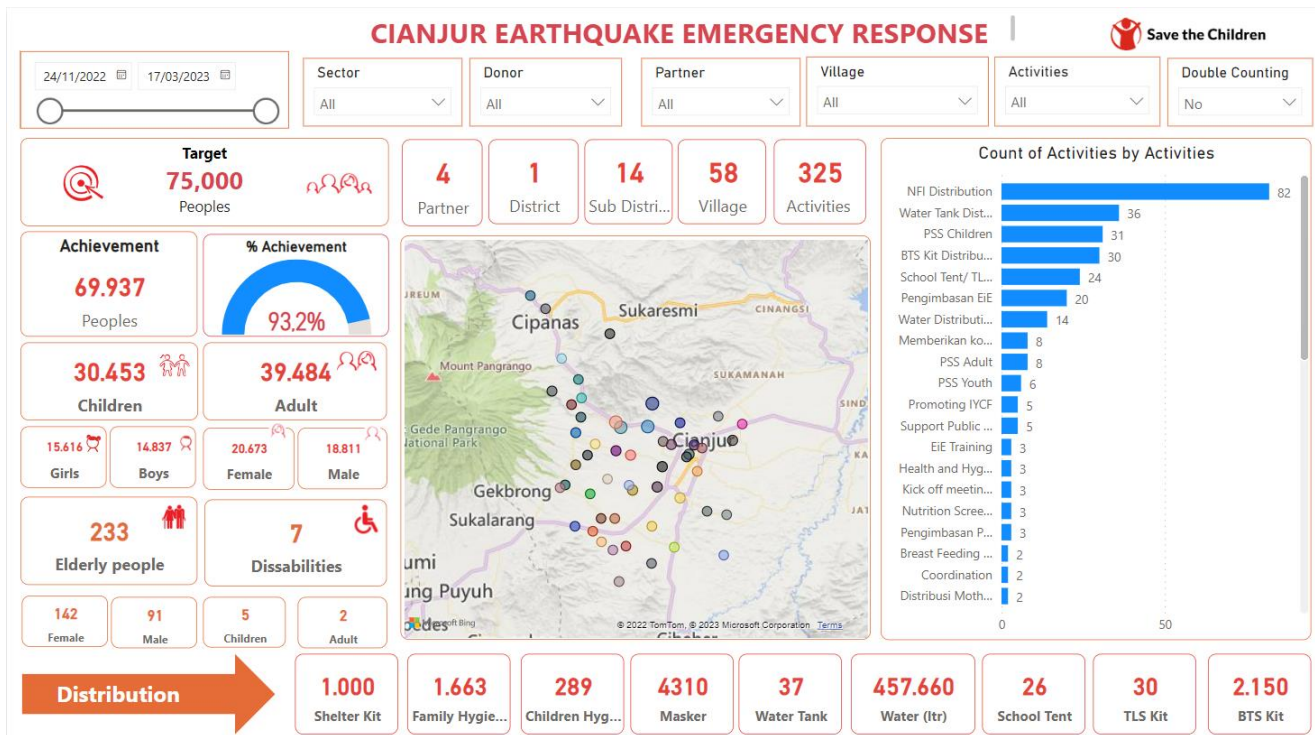
Provision of clean water with PMI (Indonesian Red Cross) Jawa Barat, PDAM (Municipal Waterworks) and DHO (District Health Office)

- SCIDN through partnership with PMI distributed 405,760 liters of clean water to 8 target locations across 4 villages in the Cugenang district. The distribution exceeded the target of 405,000 liters and reached 722 households/ 2,945 people.
- Under supervision of DHO and through community participation, the 37 units of clean water tanks distributed to them have been installed in 37 location points in 23 villages across 8 sub-districts.
- Furthermore, SCIDN donated water support system material to the Municipal Waterworks (PDAM) Tirta Mukti, consist of: water disinfectant, 1 unit of generator engine, 4 water tanks of 1000 liters, water pump machine, jackhammers, and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as raincoats, safety vest, boot shoes. The donated tools have been used by PDAM to repair the distribution lines damaged by the earthquake and maximize the distribution of clean water both to the affected communities and to their customer. 52,164 People got benefit from this support.



Health & Nutrition

- 520 pregnant and lactating women and 221 children under 2 participated in Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) provision activities in 2 villages from 2 subdistrict. 86 pregnant and lactating women joined IYCF counselling session.
- The IYCF activities include counselling, education session in maternal class, IYCF kitchen demo, IYCF practices monitoring and evaluation. Those activities have engaged local nutritionists, midwives, and respective health cadres.
- The IYCF kitchen demo has objective to promote IYCF practices on both public and private kitchen in community. This activity attended by 82 pregnant and lactating women in 2 batches.
- The education session in maternal class joined with the schedule of Integrated Health Post/Posyandu. 43 pregnant and lactating women have participated in this activity.
- Continue the children's health screening with the Ministry of Health (MoH) and Cianjur Health District Office. 200 children have been successfully reached in the screening to check their health and nutrition condition. MoH will follow up by providing vitamins and supplements needed by the children.
- The management of Breastmilk Substitute (BMS) Regulation already issued by district government. Our advocation effort continued by engaging village government to support and encourage IYCF practices specifically in promoting exclusive breastfeeding. The cross sectoral coordination meeting supported by SCIDN has conducted to promote the IYCF practices in community. This activity attended by 56 female and 7 male who also invited Head of Subdistrict, Head of Village, and Head of Community Health Centre/Puskesmas.
- The distribution of 50 baby and mother kits in 2 villages from 2 subdistricts.

"After the earthquake, until today, PDAM Cianjur committed to walk hand in hand supporting the humanitarian activity. We provide free water to any institutions, who distributed water through their water waggon. We also stop the bill collecting activity from every household in Cianjur. That's why we thankful because Save the Children could also help us in supporting that humanitarian mission. Before, any activity like buying chlorine is came from the bill we charge."



2. Farida, 39, Housewife

"Children here were experiencing a skin disease, redness appears around the feet and head after the earthquake, including my youngest child. At that time, we took water from the pond since the water at the mosque was contaminated, and the draw well was full of trash and 2 debris. Fortunately, the water tank and the faucet available in a short time so it didn't become worst."

“I learn while sing the earthquake song, I'll always remember the song. It's also about a disaster. I know how to draw the evacuation plan, prepare children's ID, standby a disaster bag, to know the assembly point. Children's ID consists of name, place and date of birth, address, school's name.”
